It took almost a year. But it is complete, and Camp Lutherhoma now has an incredible worship area for retreat guests as well as summer campers. Designed in the shape of a cross, the floor is concrete with the cross stained gold. The campfire ring even is propane assisted. We are pretty sure we can seat about 80 people around the rock benches. Thrivent Action Team Grants helped us do the landscaping, giving those enjoying this site a sense of being surrounded by a garden, with the fire ring in the center. Two ends hold smaller third rows of seats. The furthest South end of the floor is where a taller rock "altar" holds the original cross that was above the fireplace in Theimer Hall. What a blessing to "re-purpose" Theimer Hall in this way. Future plans include putting a series of memorial plaques on the front of the altar, remembering those who contributed greatly to Camp Lutherhoma over the years. Be watching for information on the future memorial project.

Summer 2020

Last summer was a true blessing from God. The campers and staff explored our theme, "Love Rises!" while studying God's Word, especially looking at I Thessalonians. We had 425 campers participating in 16 summer programs.

Outdoor Chapel Upgrades

This past spring our beloved Outdoor Chapel received several improvements. This structure, one of only a few original buildings left on site, has served as a favorite place for songs, devotions, Bible studies, skits, dances, and much more. Recently, each summer week includes several trips to the Outdoor Chapel for morning songs and devotions, Bible studies, drama options, and our own Wednesday night "Electric Campfire". The parents, campers and staff conclude each Friday with the closing program in the Outdoor Chapel.

Some of the benches are from the early years, dating back to the 1950's. Each year we rebuild or replace some of the benches, but a few originals remain. In the 1990's the gravel floor was replaced with concrete. We started using a projector to display words to songs. A few years ago we had 2 wide screen TVs donated, which are hung up high on either side of the stage. The inside and outside have been painted several times over the years.

This past spring we had the inside powerwashed and repainted. We did the same to the exterior. The colors match the same color patterns of the cabins. We also had the shingles removed and replaced with a metal roof.

Thanks to our donors who helped make this upgrade possible. Our Outdoor Chapel has not looked this good in years!

What's Up!

We often get asked if we are being affected by the Illinois River flooding. This past May, while much of Eastern Oklahoma was experiencing record flooding, by God's grace we did not get the severity of those storms. It seemed that the Illinois River watershed was just east of the major storms. Only 20-30 miles west of Camp Lutherhoma flooding caused major highways to be closed. Many towns were affected for weeks. Most of our Memorial Day Work Weekend campers could not figure out a route to get here. Some coming from the Southwest had to go far north of Tulsa before finding a highway that was open.

70 years ago, when Camp Lutherhoma moved to its current location, God directed very wise planners to place the buildings closest to the river high enough to avoid even the harshest of floods. So far, so good! We have had 3 times in the past 10 years where the Illinois rose to reach the road in front of the dining hall. However, twice it flooded the maintenance garage, which we built in the 90's.

Its not all about the golf. Yes, this is a fundraiser which has benefited the Camp Lutherhoma ministry for 10 years now. But ANYONE can show up, say hi, get a snack, and catch up with other Lutherhoma supporters. High School Camper Programs On The Rise

- Summer camp for high school age students, Dynamic, reached a 20 year high this summer with 81 campers. In 1999 we had 100.
- This past summer was also an LCMS National Youth Gathering summer, which historically has caused our Dynamic week and Journey In January to dip in attendance. Not this summer!
- Journey In January, our winter retreat for high school age campers had 77 campers this past year. That is been the average for the past 10 years, but significant during a National Youth Gathering year.
- Our Rock and Ride Adventure Trip during the summer has sustained its popularity by averaging 10 campers over the past several years.

These programs, which nurture and equip so many young adults in our church, are indications of a healthy pattern of growth. In times of competing with sports, school and job demands, these young adults and their families have seen the value in the programs offered through Camp Lutherhoma. We ask for your prayers and support for these campers and these programs to help nurture discipleship in all our campers, especially those of high school age.



What is “Electric Campfire”?

It all started when an evening campfire was about to get rained out. Rain had dampened our singing and devotions around a fire before, but one of the staff came up to John Busch (Red Sky) with an idea. This staff member had an electric guitar at camp. He also knew that we had a small sound system and a few microphones. Soon, we were playing our favorite songs in the Outdoor Chapel hooked up to amplifiers. This quickly became a tradition, known as Electric Campfire. Musicians came out of the woodwork! Drummers, Bass players, Banjo, electric guitars, and the rest is history.

Music has long been a central part of the ministry at Camp Lutherhoma. Campers get to learn and sing great Christian songs each morning at “opening” in the Outdoor Chapel, then they get to learn even more each night at campfire. To praise our Lord, Jesus Christ is one of the best ways to show Him our love and thanks, and to share in our faith with each other. The freedom to sing and dance goes way back to David in the Old Testament. We even sing a song using some of those verses. The Christian faith is expressed through the words of many camp songs, and the fun actions and phrases help us all remember these Biblical truths long after summer is over.

Electric Campfire has evolved into a full stage production. Amps, Speakers, Lights, Decorations, and Costumes! We even have Electric Campfire t-shirts for sale in the store! With donated wide screen TVs hanging on either side of the stage, the campers follow along with the words, while dancing and singing at the top of their lungs. Many songs are traditions at Electric Campfire: Jesus Freak, I’m Alive, In The Light, Jesus Loves Me, and many more. Each summer we also introduce quality Christian music they might hear on the radio or online.

Each Electric Campfire, as do all of our campfires, follows a pattern. All our songs are Christian, and we start out with loud, easy action songs to get everyone involved. Then, we transition into medium songs to help the campers start to settle down. Near the end of the campfire we focus on quieter, praise songs until we have one of the staff members give a devotion. At the close of each campfire, we sing the “Closing Song” designated for that week, and we dismiss each cabin group one-by-one. Wednesday nights at Camp Lutherhoma have become a high point for campers and staff.

Thanks to those who envisioned Electric Campfire! Thanks be to God for inspiring us to praise Him in that way! We want to invite anyone to come on Wednesday night to enjoy this joyous tradition with us. You will be blessed while we lift up our voices to Jesus.

From John Busch, Camp Director

2 years ago we demolished Theimer Hall. It was a sad experience, but necessary. We had out-grown Theimer Hall as a retreat facility once we completed Pine and Aspen. Our very wise caretaker, Daniel Overman, wanted to save all the rock that made up the exterior of Theimer Hall. He carefully pulled down the wall sections of the heavy rocks, knocked off the cement mortar on each one, put them on the trailer and moved them over near the caretaker’s house where he stacked them. These rocks were big. They had an estimated weight range of 10 to 80 pounds. We estimate over 500 rocks were cleaned, moved and stacked. We did not know at the time how they would be re-purposed for God’s glory.

A year later, we were inspired by God to see the need for an adult-friendly comfortable campfire site for retreat groups staying in Pine and Aspen. Many of these groups wanted to sit around a campfire for devotions and fellowship. The closest site was “Merry Mecco Meadow”, about 300 feet from the retreat cabins. Although it has benches upkeep during the non-summer months was hard, and some of the retreat guests could not safely navigate the rocky path.

With the help from our contractor, Anthony Faddis, we studied pictures of backyard fire pits, and decided that we wanted to create “Rock Garden” behind Pine and Aspen. And, best of all, we already had the rocks! Mr. Faddis even researched artistic pictures of Lutheran crosses, and incorporated one into the design of the floor. We had also saved the black metal cross that hung above the fireplace in Theimer Hall, and so the design evolved to also have a taller altar with the cross attached. Fundraising proceeded, receiving generous donations from several sources, including an LWML district mission grant.

As construction began we realized the rocks would have to be moved to the site. This was no easy task. They were heavy, and it was in the heat of August. So the rocks had been moved for the second time. Near the completion of construction, it was apparent that landscaping would help bring this project to another level of beauty. With the help of Jamie Aussieker we designed the garden sections surrounding the circular ring of benches. Preparations had to be made for the plants, and rocks were placed as a border of the garden. Volunteers came to help place the plants, spread top soil and mulch, and groom the garden. On November 6th the Rock Garden was finished.

You can now visit us and sit around the fire at Rock Garden. When you do, I invite you to think of the rocks that make up the benches. Once they were useful, then they seemed to have no purpose, and then they were useful again. Perhaps you can recall how you, too, felt this way. God has redeemed you, sinful with little purpose, through His Son, Jesus Christ, so that we can be useful to the building up of the Kingdom. “For we are God’s workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.” Ephesians 2:10
